All articles written under the program are to be submitted to the NEPMCC. The content produced will be made available to media organizations through a Collective Commons license so that Canadians can be better informed.
The Journalist involved in the program must submit and publish at least three to five articles pertaining to federal, provincial and municipal developments. Copies of these articles must also be forwarded to NEPMCC to be placed on our web sites. The publisher or Editor-In-Chief also confirms that the Journalist will be visiting local communities that they serve and prepare articles about the work and life of the members of the community. The NEPMCC will supply the necessary pre-paid boxes for mail through Canada Post. Necessary equipment for the work of the Journalist will be supplied by the NEPMCC upon request. Every publication associated with the program must contain at least 50 % Canadian editorial content in order to qualify for the program. Articles written under the LJI cannot be placed under a paywall online. They must be accessible to the readership without cost.
